Accessions

The Society is particularly grateful to all those individuals and societies who donate material to the library, of whom J Bell, Cliff Webb, Kent and Oxfordshire Family History Societies and the National Archives are notable for particularly large donations this quarter. The gift of an almost complete set of 1891 census return films from the Family Records Centre will take several months to catalogue but listed here are complete holdings for Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire, Cambridgeshire, Hampshire, Hertfordshire, Huntingdonshire, Northamptonshire, Oxfordshire, Surrey and Sussex, with almost complete sets for Berkshire, Kent and London/Middlesex. Other accessions include microfiche copies of registers for Gloucester St. John, St. Mary and St. Nicholas and a further two volumes of the Lincolnshire burials index.

On CD-ROM there are crew lists 1863-1913, the second "volume" of the Plymouth marriage index and Norfolk marriages 1801-37.

In book form there are National Archives readers' guides on Air Force records and Emigrants and "expats"; Federation of Family History Society basic facts series volumes on lunatics, newspaper repositories and researching in London. This Society has published another of Cliff Webb's London apprentices series for the Painter-stainers Company and the Guild of One-Name Studies has donated their latest list of members' interests. Those who use the Internet for genealogy will know of the website called Cyndi's List which does for world genealogy what GENUKI does for the UK. The two volume printed version of Cyndi's List might be seen by some as an anachronism, but the overview which it gives of Cyndi's vast site is actually very helpful. The 2004 edition of *Passenger and Immigration Lists Index* brings the total number of names indexed in the series to over 4, 300,000. This is the first volume since

the series started in 1982 not to be co-edited by P William Filby who sadly died last year. Finally there is the Library Association's guidelines for local studies provision in public libraries. Coincidentally I read recently that Westminster is contemplating a large cut in funding for its award winning local studies department. If you use Westminster Archives this could affect you!

The papers seem to relate to all the persons of the name Bennett, however spelt, and much of the material has been extracted from well-known reference books, ie visitation records, books

on the peerages and baronetages, knights, coats-of-arms, "Miscellanea Genealogica et Heraldica", biographical books, ie "Who's Who", etc, as well as books on castles and manor houses where any Bennett lived. There are also a number of photographs of various Bennetts and houses inhabited by them. There were also several large roll pedigrees which have been deposited in the Roll Pedigree Collection under Bennett.

Bourne, (small collections no 36). This very old and fragile collection is of unknown origin. The papers all appear to come from Antigua, Dominica, Demerara and Nevis in the West Indies. The papers are all dated in the second half of the 19th century. One letter from Rev John Frederick Bourne reveals that he resigned his position as Rector of St. Paul's, Demerara as he was persuaded to join the Swedenborg Church. Names other than Bourne include: Bacon, Eldridge, Fowler, Gore, Lee, Montague, Pigott and Rose. The original papers can be found in the Family History Tracts boxes in Store A.

Goodall, (small collections no 39). This collection is the work of Sir David Goodall. The first paper appeared in the "Irish Genealogist" of 1967, but this copy has a number of additions by the author. The second paper is a later expansion with some corrections. Donated by Elisabeth McDougall.

Juby, (1 box). This collection was compiled and donated to the Society by Dr Bernard Juby. It consists of several packs. 1. This, the largest pack, consists of GRO birth, marriage and death certificates, 1837-1992. 2. A list of Juby and variants GRO birth index entries, 1837-1992. 3. A list of Juby and variants GRO marriage index entries, 1837-1992. 4. A list of Juby and variants GRO death index entries, 1837-1992. 5. Phillimore marriage register for Juby and variants. 6. Savigny, (small collections no 35). Donated by Elisabeth McDougall in 2003. The papers consist mainly of references to the Huguenot family of Savigny, who became cutlers in London, and their descendants who have spread around the British Isles and overseas.
