### Accessions

This accessions list is brought to you thanks to Chris Broomfield, our Webmaster, who saved the day when our normal report generator was unable to produce the data from the catalogue.

Thanks to a filming agreement with Microform Academic Publishers some of our rare copies of the 'treble almanac' have been filmed. Other libraries and institutions, mainly in Ireland, supplied copies of their holdings for filming and we have received copies of the films containing our volumes. As a bonus, the films also include some items, held elsewhere, which we did not have in the library. These include some editions of *The English Registry* and *The Gentleman and Citizen's Almanack* (lists of English office holders etc.), various Dublin directories and the 1761 poll book for Dublin. This accessions list also includes the next batch of 1891 census return films. Those counties which have now been catalogued are: Bedfordshire, Berkshire (2 piece numbers missing), Buckinghamshire, Cambridgeshire, Cheshire, Cornwall, Cumberland (Alston registration district only so far), Derbyshire, Devon, Dorset, Durham, Essex, Gloucestershire, Hampshire, Herefordshire, Hertfordshire, Huntingdonshire, Kent (1 piece number missing), Lancashire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, London/Middlesex (4 piece numbers missing), Norfolk, Northamptonshire, Northumberland, Nottinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Rutland, Shropshire, Somerset, Staffordshire, Suffolk, Surrey, Sussex, Warwickshire, Wiltshire, Worcestershire and Yorkshire. We have also taken the opportunity to fill in some small gaps in our holdings of the 1851 census returns. Finally there are 22 films of the Kidderminster St. Mary registers.

There are several items on microfiche worthy of special mention. These include the Anstruther Catholic baptism index (strongest for the home counties), a large number of Cheshire register and MIs transcripts donated by Mike Berrell, many Hampshire BTs transcribed by R M B H Hackman, the Mary Wigan register transcripts revised and donated by Kent Family History Society, fiche transcripts of Surrey registers given by West Surrey FHS and the 3rd edition of the Surrey super index sponsored by T Boyle.

On CD-ROM there are *Pedigree resource file* discs 51-75 and master index.

In book form we have the 107th edition of *Burke's peerage, baronetage and Knightage*, the second edition of Mark Herber's excellent book *Ancestral trails*, the 8th edition of *The family and local history handbook* (incorporating the Genealogical services directory) and VCH volumes for Somerset and Staffordshire. Thanks to the bequest from a former member, Miss Ann Brining, which I mentioned last quarter, we have also been able to purchase a huge number of Devon marriage transcripts (and a few more baptisms and burials) from Devon Family History Society.

**Library catalogue**

At the beginning of this year the Society's Operations and Executive Committees had to make some hard decisions about the library catalogue. The existing server was becoming underpowered for the job, and, more importantly, it was using Microsoft's NT4 software which will no longer be supported after August this year. There seemed to be two alternatives: buy a new server or go over to the recently released e-library solution. E-library means that our software company, EOS International, hosts our catalogue on their server and all cataloguing and searches by users in the library are done over the Internet. Neither option was going to be cheap, but the e-library solution had one distinct advantage: it would provide a way of getting our catalogue onto the Internet for use outside this building.

Eventually, this was the option we decided on. A data dump was taken from our old server on 7 May and in June the staff here started cataloguing over the Internet. This means that the current catalogue in use in the library as I write is only correct as of 6 May 2004. By the last quarter of this

year, the in-house catalogue terminals will have been connected to the Internet and a new browser interface will have been customized for use by researchers within the library. By early next year we hope to roll access out to our members for use at home and then, eventually, to the world at large. There are a number of reasons for this gradual release: we will monitor use in the building first to ensure that the interface is as user friendly as possible; there will be a gradual increase in traffic on the site so that there is no danger of the server being swamped (shades of the 1901 census release!) and lastly the Genealogy Officer is worried about the level of enquiries which her small department will have to deal with once it goes live.

This is an exciting development for the Society. I hope that many more people world-wide will discover what a wonderful resource for historical research we have in our library and be encouraged to join. ## 6. SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

**Polish Collection**, comprising the notes and correspondence of Antoni and Stella Szachnowski, members of the Catholic Family History Society. It was received by the Society in November, 1999. The collection comprises two archive boxes of papers and two boxes of index cards stored amongst the Special Collections in Store A. Archive Box 1 contains correspondence and enquiries dealt with by Mr and Mrs Szachnowski during the 1980s and 1990s. This is filed in alphabetical order of the enquirer. Archive Box 2 contains the following: 1. Notes relating to Poles who came to the United Kingdom after the 1831 uprising and who were granted a pension or assistance from the grant voted by Parliament for the relief of Polish refugees, specifying the name and amount paid in each year from 1837-1842.
