Accessions

This accessions list is fairly thin due to cataloguing effort being re-directed elsewhere for a while (see the end of this report). On fiche there is an index to Lincoln Diocese marriage bonds and allegations 1774-1800 which covers Leicestershire as well as Lincolnshire. On CD-ROM we have *Swing unmasked* including the names of many agricultural workers who were involved in the Swing Riots between 1830 and 1832. In paper format there are almost 50 reprints of one inch Ordnance Survey maps, Poll Tax lists for 1377-1381, My ancestor was a coalminer and a large number of List and Index Society volumes detailing material at The National Archives. A few of the latter caused much amusement when we came to record their titles. We finally worked out that those who devised them were either being mischievous or were oblivious to the way they read on the page: "Addresses to Juries" and "Pardons to Wild birds" are actually subject indexes A - J and P - W respectively!

1841 census

Just a reminder that we now have free access from the library to the 1841 census indexes and images on the British Origins and Ancestry web sites. Pre-1851 poll books and directories

During our stock-taking week in February, it was decided to remove from the open shelves in the Middle Library all original directories and poll books published in or before 1850. This was primarily because of their intrinsic value and deteriorating condition but also to help relieve some of the overcrowding on the shelves. They have now all had their catalogue entries changed to match and are available on application in the Lower Library.
