Accessions

Anyone whose mother or grandmother served as a WAAC in World War I may know that an index to the WO 398 service records has been put up on The National Archives website. Just enter the woman's name in the search box on the home page and you can see if anything has survived for her. The qualification "survived" is important since, as with the soldiers documents, many WAAC records were destroyed in an air raid in WWII. Only 7,016 of the 57,000 Women's Army Auxiliary Corps records escaped destruction. We now have a complete set of film copies of these surviving WAAC service records thanks to a generous gift from The National Archives. Also on microfilm in this quarter's accessions you will find copies of the marriage licence allegations for the Canterbury peculiar courts covering various parishes in Kent, Surrey, Middlesex and Essex and, on microfiche, there is a surname index to 25 years worth of the Hampshire Family Historian magazine and more parish register transcripts for Northumberland and Yorkshire from the T Hutchinson bequest.

On CD-ROM, there are a large number of Kent parish register transcripts donated by Kent FHS, David Wright's London probate index 1750-1858 surnames A-E, including all London/Middlesex courts except the PCC, the Rutland marriage index 1538-1754 by Audrey and Ian Buxton, the Bristol and Avon marriage index for north Somerset 1754-1837 and the Glamorgan baptism index 1569-1837.

For some years we have had a number of small card indexes in the Upper Library which are probably overlooked by everyone. One of these, which indexes 18th and 19th century births, marriages and deaths from the Baptist Magazine, has now been typed up and put on the religions shelves. Also in the Religions area are a large number of Methodist volumes donated by C R Hailwood. There is a new Victoria County History: volume 9 for Somerset covering Glastonbury and Street and we have also managed to acquire a rare out-of-print VCH title: the genealogical extra volume entitled *Hertfordshire families*. Only two of these genealogical volumes were ever produced - the other being for Northamptonshire - and we now have copies of both. Finally there are a large number of archive, library and museum guides for South Africa donated by John Addis-Smith.
