## Accessions

This is a much bigger accessions list than usual, containing approximately 1000 items, so our Typographer has been much exercised in reducing it to fit within the set number of pages. Thanks once again go to Nick Newington-Irving, Mark Herber, various sponsors, family history societies and all those who donate material to the library. An interesting biographical dictionary of sporting greats called *The Sportfolio* (!) was given by E Whitehouse and it provides a graphic demonstration of the class system in operation at the end of the 19th century. Professional sportsmen are referred to merely by their surnames. The amateurs, who were mostly from the upper or upper middle classes, are referred to with due deference as Mr So-and-so. The latest *Passenger and immigration lists index* (for 2009!), which is not on the Ancestry.com website, brings the total number of immigrants to north America listed by this series to just under 5 million. Also in book form are more of Jack Baxter's transcripts of Essex burials and Sir Mervyn Medlycott's transcripts of Somerset MIs.

On microform there are many Cornish registers sponsored by Mr M E Runnalls, material relating to bastardy at Durham CRO 1661-1895, Norfolk registers sponsored by Mr D Moore, Warwickshire registers sponsored by Hazel Lumb and census returns for Angus (1841), Fife (1851) and Perthshire (1851 & 1861) purchased from the Lawson Edwards bequest.

There are two DVDs in this listing, both arising from the Who do you think you are? TV series. One is the how-to-trace-your-family DVD featuring Nick Barratt and the other is the footage of the first series showing Bill Oddie, Moira Stuart and co. On CD-ROM there are Lincolnshire apprentices 1710-1810, burials from

cemeteries in Lincoln (the city), Yarborough Deanery MIs, a scanned copy of a manuscript 1725 Lincolnshire poll book with transcription and index all donated by Lincolnshire FHS, three CDs of Oxfordshire register transcripts given by Oxfordshire FHS, the Surrey baptism, marriage (to 1837) and burial (to 1840 or 1865) indexes, Yorkshire Archaeological Society register transcripts, the Hussey-Walsh manuscripts of the Irish Genealogical Research Society, County Roscommon sources and the 1901 census of County Clare.

Finally, we are, at the time of writing, in the process of working out budgets for 2009. In the current economic climate expenditure will have to be looked at closely and cutbacks will inevitably occur. If you donate material, which is unbound or bound with wire or plastic comb spines, please could you consider including a cheque to cover the cost of binding? Currently we pay approximately £25 for each A4 sized volume to be bound.

**Astley Small Collection**, (Box 34, Item 125, 1 folder). This collection includes an original parchment document: 'Abstract of the Title of the Devizes in Trust under the will of the Right Honourable Jacob Henry Delaval Lord Hastings and Seaton Delaval to an Estate called the Melton Constable Estate in the County of Norfolk'. Information on a lease made between Sir Jacob Astley, Seaton Delaval and Daniel Henry Lee Warner and Henry Styleman. Includes a copy of the plan shown on the Mortgage Deed of 7 July, 1864. Other names include: Hester Astley, Georgiana Caroline Dashwood, George Dashwood, Henry Watkins Dashwood, Mary Helen Dashwood, Rev William Gorden, George Edward Graham, Baron Loftus and John Tottenham Loftus.

**Back Small Collection**, (Box 33, Item 119, 1 folder). This collection includes several 19<sup>th</sup> century documents donated by the British Records Association. There are marriage settlements, estate papers, declarations of trust, business agreements and a property release. Surnames include: Back, Brown, Chater, Hatfield and Taddy.

Also included is a large collection of family group sheets on five branches of the Pearce family, with the following surnames emphasised: Adday, Pearce, Persicketti, Pym and Rodwell.

**Billingham Small Collection**, (Box 3, Item 12, 1 folder). Computer printout of Billingham GRO marriage indexes for 1837-1945, compiled by Gary Bingham in 1999. List is alphabetical by first name for each year. Information given includes name, parish, town (only until 1876), registration district (only until 1866) and notes for some entries.

**Bosomworth Small Collection**, (Box 26, Item 93, 1 folder). This collection was donated by Mrs Pat Wilson of Wiltshire in 1994. It includes copies of the Bosomworth Beacon published by Elwyn L. There are typed notes, a pedigree of George Bosomworth (1798?-1854) and Alice Wright and an article regarding William George Orchard. **Cock Small Collection**, (Box 32, Item 117, 1 folder). This collection consists of photographs, cards and handwritten notes concerning numerous families, pre 19<sup>th</sup> century. Surnames include: Ancell, Curling, Hewitt, Maxted, Tomlin and Woodland.

**Cole Small Collection**, (Box 24, Item 83, 2 folders). Covering primarily the counties of Warwickshire, Gloucestershire, Suffolk and Hampshire, this collection includes lists of transcribed parish registers, handwritten transcriptions of wills and correspondence concerning the family of James Edwin Cole. Also includes a list of PCC wills, 1660-1700 from London, Middlesex, Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire. Most of the collection is dated 1500-1800.

**Cromwell Descendants Small Collection**, (Box 5, Item 21, 1 folder). This collection includes a typewritten narrative of the history of the Cromwell family and numerous hand-drawn pedigrees, showing descent from the Stewarts, the pedigrees of Oliver Cromwell and several other families, including Frankland, Bolton, Polhill and Williams.

**Cunningham-Durham Small Collection**, (Box 29, Item 109, 1 folder). This collection includes a typed narrative regarding the life of James Durham of County Tyrone, letters written by John Durham, a pedigree of James Durham (1669-1762) and his wife Elizabeth, research notes, a volume of pedigrees prepared by James A. Cunningham-Durham, FSA and a printed volume with handwritten annotations regarding the Durham family. Surnames include: Astley, Colquhoun, Cunningham(e), Driffield, Duke (Suffolk), Dunlop, Durham, Hogg (Southwark), Laffitte, Parke, Poyntz, Speer (Co. Tyrone, Dublin), Stoford, Toone (Co. Dublin) and Townshend.

**Donald Clark Small Collection**, (Box 37, Item 138, 1 folder). This collection was donated by Kay Donald Clark in 2006. It consists of a single notebook that contains a diary written by the great-great-great-grandmother of the donor, Ann Barnes. She was the daughter of Hannah Harrison Lowe (born 1795) who was the daughter of King George IV and Maria Fitzherbert.

**Drew Small Collection**, (Box 26, Item 95, 2 folders). This collection includes lists of wills and papers of administration of approximately 45 surnames. Those marked with an asterisk (\*) have pedigrees and/or genealogical notes as well. Surnames included are: Folder 1: Barrett, Cornell/Cornwell, Crofton, Drew(e)/Drue, Ellis/Elys/Eales/Elles, Evans\*, Hainsworth/Heyneworth, Hickford, Hollis, Hughes, Jennings/Jenyns, Johnson/Janson, Kirkbride, Milles, Morrison, Osborn, Payson, Rowland, Smith, Stokes\*, Sutton, Tiggot, West\*, Willis and Wyman. Folder 2: Allen, Beaumont, Cole, Coleman, Elly/Heley, Evans, Everett, Foote, Guy, Hickford, Josselin/Joselyn/Joslin, Mockett/Mackett, Morrison, Nicholas, Noake, Norris, Redway, Scott, Thompson, Weston, Wroughton and Wyman.

**Dryland Small Collection**, (Box 13, Item 50, 2 folders). Folder 1: primarily GRO birth, marriage and death certificates of the Dryland family from Kent, Essex, Surrey, London, Kettering, Birmingham, Stoke-on-Trent, Australia and New Zealand, including a time line of Drylands from 1295-1791. Folder 2: photocopies of PPR wills and probate records from Dryland families from 1868-1992. Donated by Wendy S. McCaw of Guildford.

**Emigrants to Argentina Small Collection**, (Box 6, Item 29, 1 folder). This collection includes a typed list of surnames and notes about numerous British families who emigrated to Argentina, a list of the members of the British Chamber of Commerce and more detailed notes and correspondence about several families, including William Guillermo Brown (1777-1857), John Hunt, Harper and Grant.

**Evelyn Small Collection**, (Box 29, Item 108, 2 folders). This collection includes notes of research done for Myrtle T. Myrtle by David Gardner and Brenda Perks, primarily in London. Also includes numerous 19<sup>th</sup> century letters and documents regarding the Evelyn family in Kent and the history and legal claims surrounding the will of William Evelyn (d. 1813) and accounting papers of William Evelyn's estate in Deptford.

**Gange Small Collection**, (Box 38, Item 140, 1 folder). This collection was compiled by Evelyn Alty of St. Albans and was donated to the Society by Enid Gingell. It consists primarily of correspondence and handwritten notes relating to the Gange family of Hertfordshire and Devon.

**Giffen Small Collection**, (Box 39, Item 144, 1 folder). This collection was donated by Ian Gill. It contains primarily correspondence relating to the Giffen family, particularly Giffen's search for his grandfather, father of George Woods Giffen. The remaining material concerns Giffen's mother, Constance Giffen and her family.

**Gostick Small Collection**, (Box 10, Item 42, 2 folders). This collection includes 2 folders and one photograph album. Folder 1: GRO birth and death certificates, funeral records and receipts, correspondence, photographs and postcards concerning the Gostick family. Folder 2: business correspondence of Harold Frederick Gostick, much of which is concerned with Hackney, where Gostick was Clerk of the Works. Photograph album of Susan Gostick.

**Grainger Small Collection**, (Box 30, Item 113, 2 folders). This collection includes information on the descendants of Benjamin Grainger and his wife Eliza Pluckrose, whom he married in 1745. Folder 1: original photographs. Folder 2: handwritten notes and family pedigree of Benjamin Grainger.

**Grants of Arms Small Collection**, (Box 36, Item 132, 1 folder). This collection, which came from British Records Association, includes handwritten lists of arms granted to various people, their place of residence and occupation. Some give description of the arms and pedigree charts. There are several printed copies of grants given to specific individuals.

**Graves Small Collection**, (Box 27, Item 97, 2 folders). This collection was compiled by Patricia Elizabeth Graves of West Sussex in 1988. It includes a pedigree for the Graves family of Cokermonth, starting with William Graves (d. 1861) and the Hardwick family, starting with William Hardwick (d. 1833). There are also notes from census records and parish registers on the Hardwick family and includes some photographs of churchyards. Other surnames mentioned: Birkett and Davidson.

**Hansard-Evans Small Collection**, (Box 33, Item 121, 3 folders). This collection consists of three 19<sup>th</sup> century documents donated by the British Records Association. These include: 1: the marriage settlement between Luke Henry Hansard and Georgiana Evans, 1851, 2: appointment of new trustees to the marriage settlement of Hansard-Evans, 1870 and 1891 and 3: release of shares owned by Georgiana Evans to Thomas Evans.

**Harding-Joshua Small Collection**, (Box 34, Item 123, 1 folder). This collection includes one original parchment document: a release made by William Harding and his wife Mary Ann to the executors of the late Battis Ford, dated 18 December, 1834.

**Heath Small Collection**, (Box 31, Item 114, 1 folder). This is a collection of original letters, many addressed to the Honorable Edward Heath, Knight of Bath and Sir John Heath of London. Most of the letters date from the period 1640-1661. Most of the letters concern land disputes, rent payments and requests for the relief of debts. One letter written by George Heath, brother of Edward.

**Hepper Small Collection**, (Box 22, Item 79, 1 folder). This collection includes primarily handwritten notes, lists and GRO birth, marriage and death certificates. Includes reference to the following surnames: Ausinder, Barlow, Berthelemy

(hand drawn pedigree), Chilvers, Downing, Eckersall, Fenton, Harney, Hepper and Wood.

**Hilton/Denne Small Collection**, (Box 14, Item 56, 1 folder). Memorial notice of Arthur Clement Hilton, Curate of St. Clement's and St. Mary's, Sandwich, Kent who died in 1877. Original of his ordination as Deacon. Numerous poems, plays and a pedigree. Various notebooks containing a detailed history of Hilton family, especially Hiltons of Kent; copy will of Henry Hilton of Hilton, Co. Durham, 1640 from PCC; architectural history of manor house known as Hylton Castle, Co. Durham; details of Denne family holdings in Kent from 1595 and several unlabelled photographs.

**Jackson Small Collection**, (Box 28, Item 104, 2 folders). This collection includes miscellaneous notes, correspondence, GRO birth, marriage and death certificates compiled by M. Jackson of London, c1973. It includes a reference to the following surnames: Callister, Hicks, Jackson, Mylechreest, Noble, Richardson and Thomason. Folder 1: notes concerning the Thomason family of Warrington; lists of parish registers and PCC Thomason family wills; gravestone inscriptions from Lymm; marriage bonds from Chester; census records; a dropline pedigree for Walter Murray Mylechrest and Eleanor Callister Jackson; a pedigree for the Hicks family and lists of Noble family references in Walton, Yorkshire. Folder 2: typed lists of Noble family baptisms, marriages and burials in Torpe Arch.

**Jenkins (A) Small Collection**, (Box 15, Item 58, 1 folder). Research notes from the late Mrs Susan Jenkins, a member of this Society from 1986 to 1997. Work relates to the following surnames: Amey, Dando, Edwards, Hickman, Hoste, King, Price and Shearman, primarily the 19<sup>th</sup> century in England.

**Jewish Museum Small Collection**, (Box 36, Item 133, 1 folder). This collection was donated by the Jewish Museum and apparently compiled by Sir Thomas Collyer-Fergusson, sometimes on behalf of the Jewish Historical Society. It includes numerous letters addressed to Sir Thomas in London from the JHS concerning research he was conducting into various families, a typed history of the Barrow/Baruch family and a transcript of the will of John Montefiore. There are several pedigree charts: Henry Cohen, Burnett and Sarah Cohen, Abraham Furtado and Edward and Adelaide Lee. Other surnames include: de Costa Andiaide, Joseph, Moses, Salaman/Solomon, Schiveittzer and Simon.

**Johnston Small Collection**, (Box 36, Item 130, 1 folder). This collection was compiled by W. Gordon Laycock and Sarah Johnston and donated by Laycock of Yorkshire. It includes letters, research notes, copies of census returns, directories, ordnance survey maps, typed manuscripts and a hand drawn pedigree of the Johnston family starting with Samuel Johnston (1792-1856) and his wife Eliza Pennell (1802-72).

**Jowers Small Collection**, (Box 16, Item 60, 1 folder). This collection consists of material donated to the Society by J. E. Jowers of Harrow, Middlesex in March, 2000. It includes a manuscript entitled: 'A Sojourn in the Desert', a diary kept by W. Edward Alibone, husband of Kathleen Alibone (nee Jowers); an award mounted on wood presented to Elijah Cook of Wickam Market, great grandfather to Kathleen Alibone; a computer generated list of the Jowers family members with addresses; and a typed index of PPR wills and administrations, photocopies of same, dated from 1858-1992 of various Jowers family members. A list of Jowers GRO births, marriages and deaths, together with memoirs of the

donor are on the Family History Collection shelves (FH/JOW).

**Kerfoot Small Collection**, (Box 28, Item 102, 1 folder). This collection was compiled by Kathleen May Kerfoot (1911-2003) and donated to the Society by the executor of her estate, Paul Bosonnet. Includes information on Kathleen Kerfoot's son, John Herbert Kerfoot, a Royal Marine who died in the Second World War and genealogical information about the family of Louisa Higgs, Kathleen Kerfoot's mother. The information on the Higgs family consists of an outline descendent chart showing the line from King Henry II to John Higgs, c1608 and a transcript of the wills of John Higgs (1624), William Higgs (1667), Nathaniel Higgs (1752) and John Higgs Elder (1814). There is also a collection of correspondence to Mrs B. Perridge concerning research into several families: Dann, Delf, Gooderham and Knights, with pedigree charts and family record sheets for the same families.

**Killon Small Collection**, (Box 13, Item 51, 1 folder). Research notes compiled by Miss M. R. Killon of Hertfordshire. It includes handwritten notes of GRO births (1837-1939), marriages (1837-1911) and deaths (1837-1937) on the Cornford surname and following variants: Comfort, Comport, Conford and Cornfoot.

**Kingston Small Collection**, (Box 15, Item 59, 1 folder). Collection research notes on the Kingston family from England, Ireland, United States and Australia, including GRO indexes of births and deaths, birth certificates and hand drawn pedigrees. The collection came from the papers of Brian Kingston, a member of the Guild of One-Name Studies and were donated by Geoffrey Wilson, 441 West Nittany Avenue, State College, Pennsylvania 16801, USA.

**Kytchnynman Small Collection**, (Box 4, Item 15, 1 folder). Pedigree for John Kytchnynman of Chapel Allerton, starting in c1500, with hand drawn pedigrees, some of which are taken into the 1900s. Also includes pedigrees for the Rothwell and Newnham families.

**Laurence-Edridge Small Collection**, (Box 32, Item 118, 1 folder). This collection is a single 19<sup>th</sup> century document donated by the British Records Association. It is a settlement deed prior to the marriage of Randall Laurence the Elder and Miss Ann Edridge.

**Lodder Small Collection**, (Box 5, Item 22, 1 folder). This collection includes typed notes of the life and family of William Philip James Lodder (1779-1867), transcript of his will, notes on wills of other Lodder family members (1875-1938), pedigree and transcripts of correspondence of and to William Lodder. The collection also includes notes about the Loutherboung family and photocopies with typed list of letter, many in French.

**Lomas Small Collection**, (Box 30, Item 112, 2 folders). This collection includes original documents concerning Sarah Ann Cook and William Lomas. Folder 1: indenture by William and Sarah Ann Lomas of Middlesex and Sussex regarding their marriage settlement (1845), appointment of trustees for the marriage settlement (1892) and the probate of William Lomas (1899). Folder 2: marriage settlement of William Lomas and Sarah Ann Cook (1845).

**London Small Collection**, (Box 37, Item 139, 2 folders). This collection was donated by Vera London. Part of it has been separated and is in the Document Collection under 'London'. What is left in the Small Collections contains GRO birth, marriage and death certificates; references to the London surname in charter rolls from 1226-1516; references
